
Middle School Affinity Groups -- What's It All About?

Seasonal influenza rates are beginning to rise in New York City. The best protection for your family is the annual flu vaccine. The ideal time to get the vaccine is at the start of flu season (around October in the U.S.), but getting vaccinated as late as March may still help. Did You Know? CPR Training Mandated as a Graduation Requirement

The New York State Board of Regents has mandated that all students in the state be taught hands-only CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and the use of AEDs (automated external defibrillators) before graduating from high school. At BFS training for members of the Class of 2017 will take place on Tuesday, Jan. 17, 9am to 10am in the black box theater at Lawrence Street.

Getting Ready for Reenrollment

Reminder: Families with open balances for tuition and afterschool need to be up-to-date with payments before their reenrollment contracts will be released. Questions should be directed to the **Business Office**. **Reenrollment contracts** will be sent by e-mail at the end of next week to parents' e-mail addresses in My BackPack. The due date for signed contracts with the required nonrefundable deposit is Jan. 23 at 4pm. Double-check that your e-mail data is correct on **My BackPack** to avoid any miscommunication.

School Policy on Severe Weather

In the event of severe weather or a citywide emergency: When NYC public schools announce they will be closed, BFS will be closed. [Stay tuned for Mayor's announcement on TV, radio etc.) Moreover, in any instance of an unscheduled school closing, it is BFS policy to notify parents and staff through our automated phone system (voice and text), e-mail blast, and announcements on the school website and telephone greeting.
