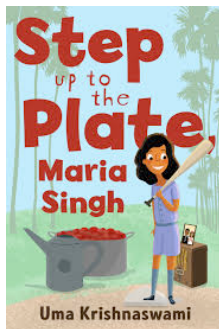

 Now that summer is almost here we offer you a list of books we hope you will enjoy reading this summer. Remember the public libraries are open and cool!

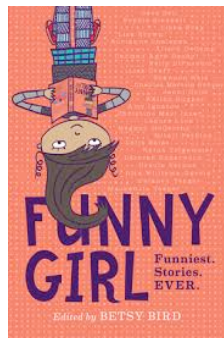

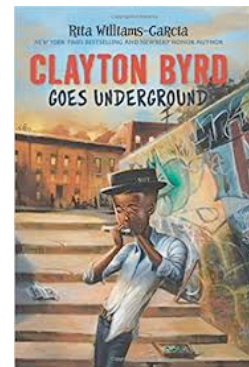

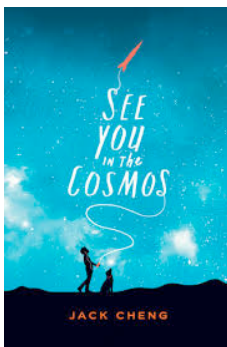
Step Up to the Plate, Maria Singh

 It's 1945 in California and Maria is about to become a member of the first girls' softball team at her school. Unfortunately, she will also experience racism and discrimination.



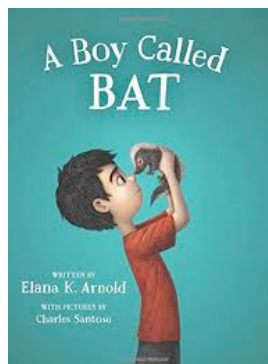
Funny Girl: Funniest. Stories. Ever.

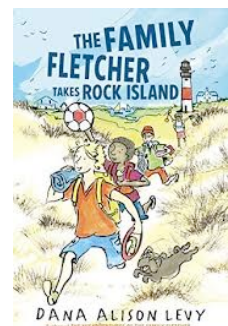

Road Trip! Join Charlie and his family for a trip across the country. Be prepared to be uplifted, to laugh and to cry, and to be reminded of the beauty around us.



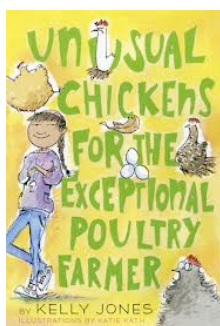

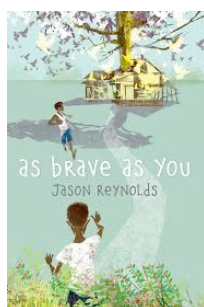
The Family Fletcher Takes Rock Island

City-kid Sophie Brown has no idea what she's in for when her family moves to a farm.



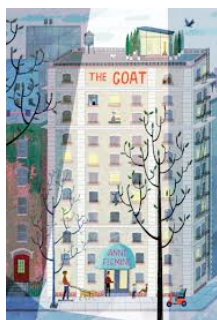
As Brave as You by Jason Reynolds

Genie and Ernie leave Brooklyn for a summer with their grandparents in Virginia. Can two city kids adapt to a different world in the country?



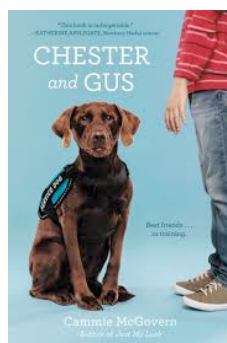
Big & Little Questions by Julie Bowe

Summer is over and Wren has a big secret : her parents have separated. What will she do when her friends find out? How will she learn to accept the changes in her family?



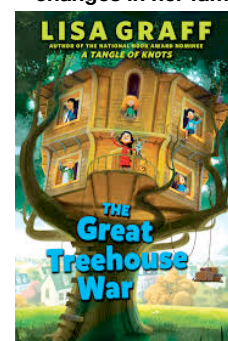
The Goat by Anne Fleming

Chester and Gus by Cammie McGovern

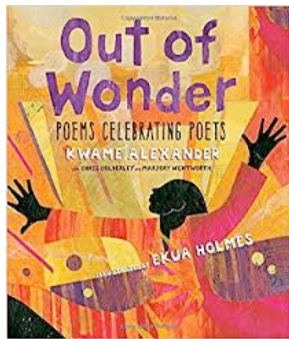
Chester has always wanted to be a service dog. His new owner, Gus, has autism and isn't exactly the person Chester thought he would be helping. A lovable friendship binds them together.



The Great Treehouse War by Lisa Graff

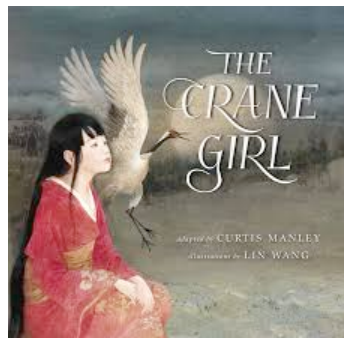

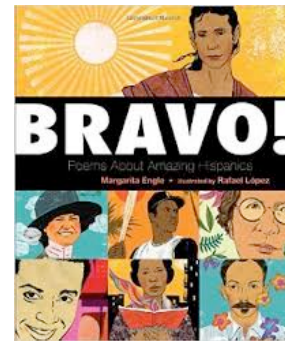

A Newbery Award Medalist and a Caldecott Honoree team up to celebrate poets with poems.



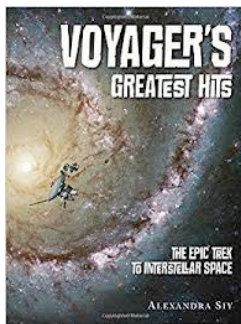
The Crane Girl

A Japanese folktale is retold with a spin on the ending. Manley's use of Haiku and Lin's illustrations bring new life to a popular story.



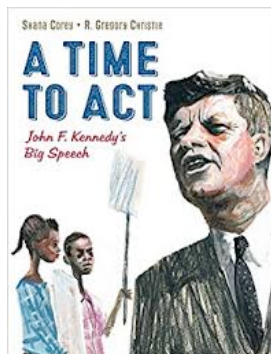
Bravo!: Poems About Amazing Hispanics

Check out the beautiful biographical poems telling the stories of notable Latinos and Latinas.



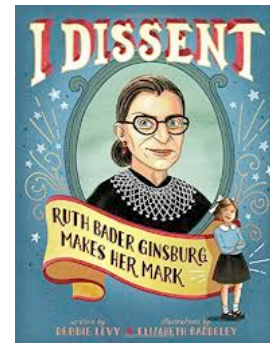
Voyager's Greatest hits

It's the 40th anniversary of the twin space probes! Learn all about the Voyager's amazing discoveries, missions, and scientists.



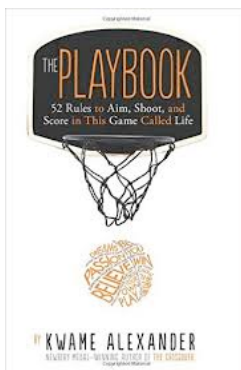
A Time to Act

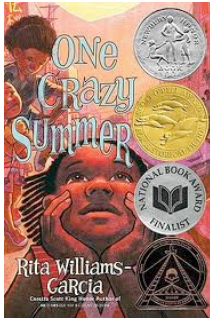

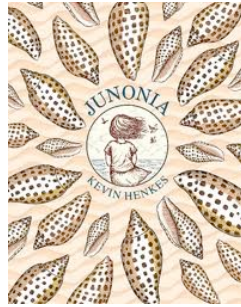

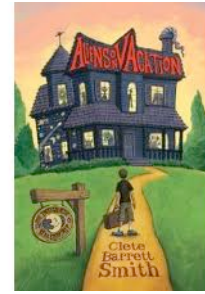
Three sisters go to California to spend time with a mother they do not know during the 1960's. Notice all the medals on the cover?

by Kevin Henkes.

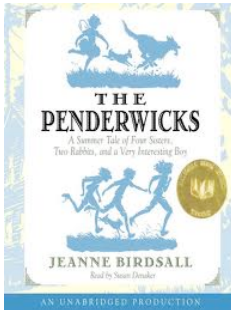
Every summer, Alice and her family spend time in Sanibel, Florida. This year things are different and Alice is not happy about it.

by Clete Barrett Smith.

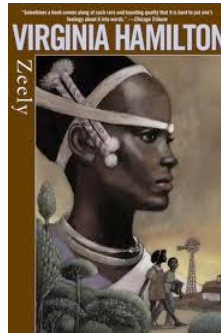
David is not thrilled to be spending the summer with his Grandmother, until he discovers that her Bed and Breakfast is a secret haven for vacationing aliens.

by Jeanne Birdsall.

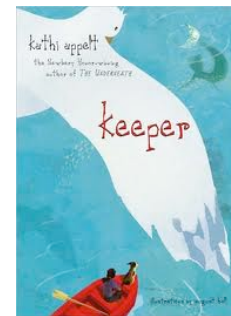
The Penderwick family consists of four sisters, an absent-minded professor father, and a dog. While on vacation the girls plot to save their new friend, Jeffrey from military school.

by Virginia Hamilton.

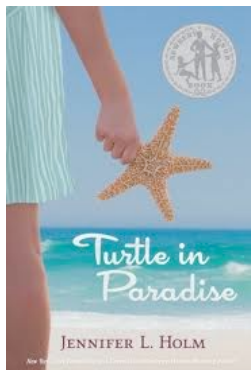

Kathi Appelt

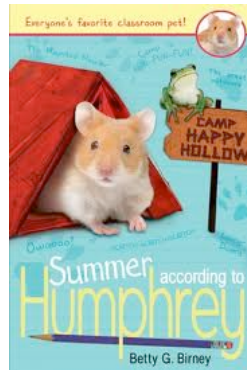

by Jennifer L. Holm.

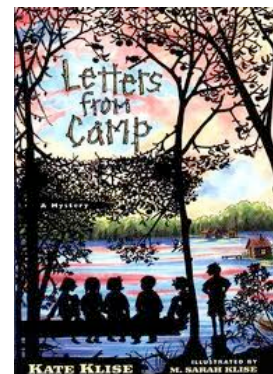
Turtle goes to live with some relatives in Key West when her mom finds a housekeeping job in 1935.
