One June night, Daniel and his mother watch hundreds of horseshoe crabs in the ocean. In the morning, Daniel finds one lone injured crab. Can he save it?

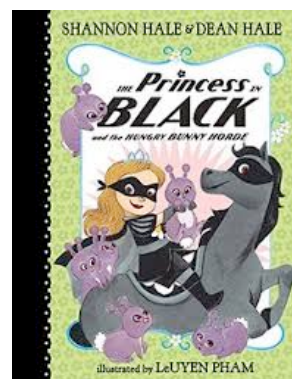

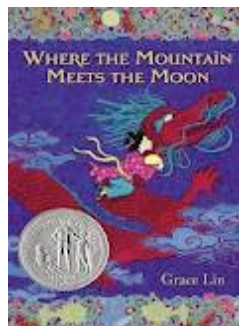
