

Rally & March through downtown Brooklyn to #Save227Duffield Saturday September 28th, 1pm -4pm Gather at 227 Duffield Street at 1pm

Brooklyn activists and community groups are in an urgent struggle to stop developers from demolishing 227 Duffield Street, the last known standing historic site on Abolition Place, in downtown Brooklyn. 227 Duffield is where well-known abolitionists lived and where Black people found freedom through the Underground Railroad. Our demand is that the NYC Landmark Preservation Commission make 227 Duffield Street a landmark so that it can be turned into a museum to preserve its important historic contribution to the fight against racism in the US.
