Almost 31 million people in the U.S. have diabetes, and an estimated 86 million have pre-diabetes. Type 1 diabetes is usually diagnosed in children and young adults, who must take insulin every day. Type 2 diabetes may develop at any age, but usually occurs in middle-aged and older people. While type 1 diabetes cannot be prevented, there are steps individuals can take – such as eating well and exercising – to prevent the more common type 2 diabetes. 

### **Game Highlights**

In our first week of interscholastic competition this winter season:

- The **Boys JV Basketball Team** had three wins: On Monday they defeated Staten Island Academy **65-33** in the lower gym, with big contributions from Charlie B, 24 points, Judah B, 12 points, and Xavier G, 14 points. On Wednesday the team defeated Berkeley Carroll **64-59** on the road. The Panthers stormed back following a deficit at halftime and pulled out the victory. Bryce K. had a game high 24 points and Judah B. scored 22 points. The boys finished the week on Friday with a **71-51** victory over Grace. Blue Pride All the Way!
- The **US Boys & Girls Swim Team** participated in their first Meet of the season with Packer at St. Francis College Pool. The Panthers had 10 swimmers participate in the meet, 6 boys and 4 girls; all competed in relays.

Also this week, Girls Varsity Basketball played and came up short in games with Berkeley Carroll and Leman Prep, and Boys Varsity Basketball had a loss to Staten Island Academy with a final score of 67-60.

On Monday, 11/25, Varsity and JV Boys Basketball play Packer at Packer, and Varsity Girls Basketball play packer at home. Middle School games begin in December. All winter athletic games, home and away, are now on the <u>BFS website calendar</u>. We hope to see you cheering at a game.
