The lower gym was packed as both schools came out to cheer on and support their teams — what a wonderful atmosphere for a high school basketball game! BFS came out strong and never looked back, as they fought for a victory to improve their league record. Leading the way for the Panthers was senior Ty S., who poured in with 29 points, picked up 5 steals, and had 3 assists. Fellow senior Finn S. scored 24 points, grabbed 18 rebounds, had 8 blocks, and 2 steals. Both players combined for 53 of BFS' 85 points.
