The ideal candidate is a flexible, culturally competent educator who is capable of partnering with the 7th & 8th grade English teacher and English Department Chair in order to take lead responsibility for a course focused on teaching reading, writing, and grammar through thematic studies such as community, justice, and the American dream. Responsibilities will include daily lesson planning, grading and feedback, report writing, and serving as a Middle School Advisor to eight or nine students. Advisors oversee students' progress in all classes, oversee students social and emotional wellbeing, serve as the primary contact with parents, and participate in other responsibilities such as overnight trips, leading anti-bias and social-justice activities, and building positive school culture.

- Serve as an advisor in the middle school
- Other duties specified by divisional leadership
