The ideal candidate is a flexible, culturally competent educator who is capable of partnering with other 6th grade level teachers and the English Department Chair in order to take lead responsibility for a course focused on teaching reading, writing, and grammar through the thematic study of multiple and diverse genres. Responsibilities will include daily lesson planning, grading and feedback, report writing, and serving as a Middle School Advisor to a small group of students. Advisors oversee students' progress in all classes, support students social and emotional wellbeing, serve as the primary contact with parents, and participate in other responsibilities such as overnight trips, leading anti-bias and social-justice activities, and building positive school culture.
