

# Why Silence?

*WHY SILENCE* is a presentation for all BFS families and colleagues, sponsored by the Spiritual Life Committee, on **Tuesday, March 3 from 5:30-6:30 pm** at Pearl Street. This gathering will focus on an understanding of silence in Quakerism, why and how it is practiced, and the use of silence in a Friends school setting. There will also be a *worship* 

*share* (Quaker meeting guided by a query) on how we can use silence in our own lives and in our families.

• "One of the main characteristics of a Friends Meeting for Worship is silence. **We usually** affirm children for their words, but do we ever affirm them for their silence? Silence can be the capacity to not have the easy answer. We need to affirm the time for dreaming, for imagining, for vision-making - the time for the interior images to meet the images of the world. Silent time can become a centerpiece of the school's rhythms, a way to deal with problems, to celebrate, to respond to tragedies, either in the school or in the world." - Dorothy Flanagan, The Mystery of Meeting for Worship (Friends Council on Education)



#### When Youth Advocacy Turns into Action

Informed advocacy for reform in prisons and the criminal justice system is a long term interest among many in the Middle and Upper School, and one of the topics they delve into as part of the school's **Service Learning and Civic Engagement** curriculum. "Solitary is Torture" was the call of the day when a group of 8th grade students traveled to the NY State Capitol in Albany to be on the front lines of the **HALT Solitary Advocacy Day**. HALT refers to the Humane Alternatives to Long-Term (HALT) Solitary Confinement Act, and the students pressed government officials to pass this important piece of legislation.
