The Director of Technology is an all-school role and a member of the BFS leadership team. At the helm of the ever-expanding role of technology within schools, the Director will work with with BFS students from age two through 12th grade, and colleagues in each Learning Community, academic, and non-academic department.

The ubiquitous nature of technology requires the Director to bridge the academic and operational realms of the school, while serving as the expert and advocate for technological innovation on the BFS Leadership Team. Below are the all-school and leadership responsibilities, followed by responsibilities pertaining to the academic (Educational Technology) and operational (Information Technology) realms.

Communication: Ensure prompt and regular communication with the Head of School, CFOO and Assistant Head of School, regarding successes, concerns, and possibilities within the realm of technology at BFS.

Strategic Vision: The Director will identify opportunities to inject technological innovation to the BFS Strategic Vision

Systems: Lead the school's efforts to ensure a dynamic and integrated technology system, including appropriate and ambitious standards and procedures. Regularly audit, assess, and recommend system upgrades, enhancements, and retirements.

Participate: Join and actively participate in various school-wide committees, efforts, initiatives and task forces.

Belonging: Leveraging technology and expertise, promote diversity, equity, and belonging goals, initiatives, and policies in line with the school's vision and Quaker identity.

Policies: In partnership with General Counsel, review, revise, enforce and promote the school's acceptable use of technology policy to reflect current best practices of colleague & student safety and security.

Community: Take a primary role in promoting learning and building a sense of community among the Leadership, IT and EdTech teams.

Information Technology

Supervising and managing the daily work of a dedicated team of IT Specialists at BFS, the Director will provide hold high standards for the IT team while empowering them to proactively and creatively problem-solve by modeling versatility and collaboration for the BFS community. Overseeing all technological resources and assets at Brooklyn Friends School, the following outlines specific areas of leadership within the Information Technology realm.

Hardware, Software & Systems:

Oversee the procurement, installation, training, configuration, maintenance, and upgrades to school software, applications, devices, and systems.

Community Voice: The Director will serve as a crucial voice in the planning and execution of community events of varying scale. Demonstrating curiosity and listening skills, BFS will rely on the Director of Technology to propose and implement ideas for the use of technology across all areas of the school, with an emphasis on innovative technological solutions.



Infrastructure: Understanding the connection between technology and campus, the Director will work closely with the BFS operations teams to ensure a seamless integration of technology to the campus spaces.

Budgetary: In partnership with the CFOO, assess current and future budgetary needs to maximize the impact of a BFS education while remaining mindful of our mission.

Build Understanding: Model for and guide full technology team to provide information about training services and research, including preparing memos and making presentations, accompanied by training videos/manuals (that when necessary, are customized).

Network: Ensure availability, reliability and security of the school's network systems, including backups.

Security & Safety: Develop and implement network security procedures, including testing and addressing vulnerabilities and disaster recovery planning.

Educational Technology

With a keen understanding of the technological infrastructure of BFS, the Director will serve as a critical leader and collaborator in the design of an ethical and innovative technology curriculum, with an emphasis on cultivating the skills necessary for aspiring changemakers. The Director of Technology supervises a dedicated team of Educational Technology Integrators to ensure the curriculum is robust and responsive. Outlined below are areas of leadership within the educational technology realm at BFS.

Innovation: In partnership with the Educational Technology Integrators, the Director will strengthen the instructional practice across each learning community in developmentally- appropriate manners. The Director paves the way for BFS students to exercise responsible digital citizenship and to leverage technology as a critical, dynamic tool for change-making.

Emerging Technologies: In collaboration with the Integrators, the Director will research, evaluate, recommend, design, and deliver emerging educational technologies that support teaching and learning.

Curriculum Leadership: Providing technical support to curriculum leaders and teaching colleagues regarding device usage, software, applications, and general use of technology in the classroom. Serve as a thought partner to colleagues to infuse innovative technological solutions into their daily work with BFS students.

Training & Education: Establish systems for colleagues to access, preview, or receive training on the usage of the school's hardware, software, and other technological systems. The Director will also be responsible for organizing and leading high-quality professional development opportunities for BFS colleagues.
